# Who is a “Contributor?”

A “contributor” is anyone who must include personal and financial information on the FAFSA.

Each contributor must create their own StudentAid.gov Account(FSA ID) and consent to share their tax information on the form.

# Which Parent or Parents are Contributors?

**If the student's parent(s) are...**

Married (not separated) and filed taxes jointly, only one parent is required to be a contributor.

Married (not separated) and didn't file taxes jointly, both of your parents are contributors.

Not married to each other and live together, both of your parents are contributors.

# Which Parent or Parents are Contributors?

## If the student's parent(s) are...

Divorced, separated, or never married, and don't live together, the parent who provided more financial support during the last 12 months is the contributor.

Divorced, separated, or never married; don't live together; and provided an exact equal amount of financial support or if they don't support you financially, the parent with the greater income and assets is the contributor.

If the contributing parent is now married and did not file taxes jointly with their current spouse, their spouse is also a contributor.
